



Maureen Spencer is a registered nurse with a master's degree in education and board certification in infection control. Currently serving as an Independent Infection Preventionist Consultant, she previously held the position of Infection Prevention Consultant for Commonwealth Medicine at UMass Medical School during the COVID pandemic. Earlier in her career, she was the Director of Clinical Implementation and Education at Accelerate Diagnostics in Tucson, AZ, and also served as the Corporate Director of Infection Prevention for Universal Health Services. Additionally, she held roles such as Infection Control Director at New England Baptist Hospital and Director of the Infection Control Unit at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, along with various other infection prevention positions in the Boston area.

In recognition of her contributions to the field, Maureen received the APIC Carole DeMille Lectureship Award in 1990 for excellence in infection prevention. She was honored as an APIC Hero of Infection Prevention in 2007 and, in 2012, was named one of the "Who's Who of Infection Prevention." In 2017, she earned the designation of Fellow of the Association for Professionals in Infection Control and Epidemiology (FAPIC) for her advanced practice in the field. She has delivered numerous lectures and presentations at AORN and APIC conferences and is recognized as a national and international speaker on various topics related to infection prevention and control.

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
